## About the department

The Geography Department is one of the world's leading centres for geographical research and training. It has an outstanding reputation for offering a wide variety of exciting and accessible modules which may readily be combined with subjects from other disciplines. The range of modules on offer below reflects the breadth of the subject, from human geography to physical science. The Department offers particular specialism in the study of globalisation, development studies, environmental change, modern cities, geopolitics and environmental management. As well as the academic programme, the student-run Geography Society organises regular events.

## **Entry requirements**

Level 1 modules have no specific prerequisites but a background in Geography can be useful for Level 2 and Level 3 modules. All modules are open to any Study Abroad, International Exchange and European Exchange students. However, as students interested in Geography modules have diverse backgrounds, each application is assessed on its own merits.

Students visiting Royal Holloway for Term 1 only (Autumn term) should take the V module versions as these have modified assessments to account for students not being available for Summer examinations.
